Textpilot is an intelligent, multi-sensory software solution that aids with reading, composing and comprehending text. The software features a carefully thought-out design and interaction model to cater for the needs of a diverse group of users, from people with ordinary writing and reading skills, to those with learning disabilities, such as dyslexia, mobility impairments, or users with visual impairments.

<u>SpeechTEK Europe's Multimodal Challenge</u> has been running all year, with entries representing a range of innovative applications, including personal assistants for mobile devices, an electronic entry doorman, and tools for aiding the handicapped. <u>SpeechTEK Europe</u> Programme Chair and member of the Multimodal Challenge judging panel, Jim Larson, commented today,

"The Multimodal Challenge submissions demonstrated a variety of user input technologies, including keyboard, speech recognition, speaker recognition, face recognition, and special input devices.

"Our panel of multimodal experts evaluated each submission using the four criteria of originality, user experience, required user training, and quality. The judges unanimously voted Textpilot, from Include As, as the winner."

In addition to the Expert's Prize, delegates on site at <u>SpeechTEK Europe</u> were invited to vote for their own favourite application. The winner of the People's Choice award went to Angel Multimodal Application (Angel-MM), an iPhone application that enables users to engage IVR systems in real-time multimodal interactions.

SpeechTEK Europe took place in London this week. Launched last year, the event aims to replicate the success of its sister event in New York by providing a forum that links together research and real-world applications of speech technologies and strategies.
